SUBS 2018 – ONLINE PAYMENT VIA CLUBSPARK

You should already have received an email about the online payment system we have introduced this year. We are using ClubSpark which we already use for our online court booking system and which Rachael uses for booking coaching sessions etc. You can either pay in one go or spread the cost over 10 monthly payments. This is definitely the best way of collecting subs – it is easier for you and much easier for us as a club to administer and keep track of payments. We also need everyone to have paid by 1st April. Once you have

paid, you will be given this year's entry code for the keypad. If anyone has a genuine issue with paying online then please contact Cath.

CLUB FACILITIES

Let's highlight the positives first – of which there are many:

- Newly painted changing rooms, toilets and entrance lobby
- New lighting in those areas
- Four courts cleaned
- New windows throughout the clubhouse
- Wood cladding around the clubhouse re-stained
- Practice wall repaired and painted
- New guttering
- New gates and keypad
- Area at the back of the clubhouse cleared
- Picnic bench (in memory of Dee)
- New curtains
- All the extra small improvements Cath has made in the clubhouse
- Flower tubs
- Two sets of score cards

That is a long list and it all adds up to making the club look much smarter at the start of this season than it did at the start of last. Huge thanks to Martin for all the hours he put in on decorating the toilets and changing rooms – they look SO much better.

Thanks also to Kelvin Webb for painting the entrance lobby and the outside and to Phil Anderson who painted the practice wall which has made a huge visual impact to the look of the courts. Thanks also to Kirsten who organised the new gates and keypad.

Massive apologies to anyone I've omitted to thank!!

Unfortunately the long list of positives is followed by one fairly large negative – namely that the issue of the sewage system is yet to be resolved.

In an ideal world we would just be able to replace the old septic tank with an updated model and our friends from the Recreation Trust/Town Council as landlords would offer to help out with the cost.

However, we can't put in another septic tank as regulations have changed and it is deemed too close to the Lyd and liable to flooding.

Of the other options available to us, one involves running a pipe over the Lyd to a sewer on the other side (Severn Trent/Environment Agency not happy with this option as there is a (very slight) risk of pollution if the pipe leaks – seriously, have they looked in the Lyd recently??

Option 2 is to run pipework across the practice pitches to a sewer by the Football Club (the Trust aren't happy with this as it will disturb the drainage system on the practice pitches).

So the only option we are left with is to instal a sewage treatment plant which, of course, is the most costly option.

At present, there is still some debate about which size of plant we need and what additional costs would be involved. However, we have just learned that the funding bid which Martin put in to the Town Council has been successful and they are going to give us £1000 towards the cost. Although this represents a small part of the total cost, we should be able to finance the rest through club funds although it will use up pretty much all our cash. So, who knows, by the end of the season you may be able to flush with confidence!

FUNDING/FUNDRAISING

Thanks to all of you who took the time to go online and vote for us on the Aviva website as part of our bid to get funding towards the cost of replacing the sewage system. Although we weren't successful we still got £500 for making it through to the final round – so definitely worth having. Thanks to Martin and Kelly-Ann El-Shawk at Wildin's who assisted with the bid.

In the autumn we took part in the Tesco in-store funding initiative – many thanks to everyone who put their little blue tokens in the appropriate place! We have received £1000 from Tesco which will go towards the re-painting of 2 of the courts as this is what was stipulated on the bid.

Although the club receives regular information about funding opportunities, if anyone hears of anything for which we might be eligible to apply then please let a member of the committee know.

Our in-house fundraising continues with the Bonus Ball organised by Julia. £24 will secure you a number, half of which goes into club funds and half goes into the monthly prize draw. If you haven't already joined then contact Julia – julia_goss@yahoo.co.uk or 517117.

Raffles which have taken place at various club events throughout last year have also made a contribution to club funds, especially the one held on the day of the Junior Christmas/Adult Touch Tennis tournaments. It raised sufficient to buy 2 sets of score cards to go on the nets. Particularly good for those of us who are concentrating so hard on their game or who have completely lost the plot by 8 pm, that they can't remember the score!

Rachael has continued to lead another varied and packed year of coaching at the club – a year which has also seen her mentor Cath Hutchinson to achieving her first tennis coaching qualification. Congratulations Cath!

Rachael started the year by attending the Female Coaches Conference in Birmingham, hosted by Judy Murray and returned with even more specific ideas for coaching female players.

In February she was selected by the LTA to be a 'Tennis for Kids' Coach and, after a training session in Exeter, ran a 6 week course at the club for 10 five to seven year olds. It proved very successful and some of the children have continued to play. She has applied to run another Tennis for Kids course this year.

Then of course there was all the usual junior and adult coaching, Cardio, Open Days, organising Touch Tennis and Tie Break Tens tournaments, Live Ball – oh yes, and helping the newly-formed Ladies C team to win their division!

For her endless enthusiasm for a coaching programme which draws in more and more people each year, the committee again nominated Rachael for the Gloucestershire Coach of the Year Award. Having finished in third place in 2016, last year she was runner up to the coach at Oxstalls, for which many congratulations but given that the LTA's stated aim is to attract more girls and women into tennis, we feel she should have won.
